

Most Asked Question's for ABC Operator Requirements

Question:

What do I have to do to start the certification process?

Answer:

To meet the Operator Training requirement of the Solid Waste Disposal Act as amended by the Energy Policy Act of 2005, each UST facility will:

Have UST facility operators that are registered and have three classes of operators: A, B, and C.

Training and Testing

Class A and B operators must successfully complete an approved operator training course within the six-month period prior to application.

All training courses must be approved by the DERR.

Only Class A and B operators must pass an exam approved by the DERR

Registration

Class A and B

Must submit a registration application to the DERR, documenting proper training, and pay any applicable fees.

Class A and B registration will be effective for a period of 3 years, and will not expire if the registered operator leaves the company they were working for.

Question:

Can I be an A, B and C operator?

Answer:

Yes, but an A, B, or C must be on site during normal operation hours.

Question:

How does the Class C operator get certified?

Answer:

Class B Operator's are responsible for class C operator's to get trained and registered, and are on-site during operating hours.

Question:

Who trains the class C operator?

Answer:

It is the responsibility of the class B operator to train the class C operator.

Question:

Does the class C operator have to take the training?

Answer:

No, the training for the class C operator is the responsibility of the class B operator.

Question:

Does the class C operator have to take the exam?

Answer:

No
